Million Dollar Point | Espiritu Santo | Vanuatu

At the end of WWII, the Americans were forced to leave the military base and its remaining goods behind, everything from cranes, bull dozers, weaponry to bottles of Coca-Cola . The goods were offered for sale to the French and British at a very low price, 6 cents to the dollar. Assuming that if the goods were not sold , the U.S. military would be forced to simply leave them behind for free.

The Americans were having none of this, why should they have them for free ! So to spite the British and the French, the military made the rash decision to drive all of the vehicles, food, clothing and other equipment to a wharf on the south coast of the island. The army then drove all of the vehicles into the sea and used bulldozers to dump the remaining supplies, before also driving the bulldozers into the sea, ensuring that the European countries would not be able to get their hands on the items at all, free or otherwise.

Named for its worth, there are a multitude of bulldozers, cranes, fork lifts, ships and trucks piled upon one another at this unique dive site. The mangled mess of metal is one of the most incredible and unique dives you can visit. Descending down to a maximum of 40m this site is perfect for underwater photography with its always crystal clear blue water.
